## **RE:** Clarifying the Discontinuation of a Non-surgical, Permanent Birth Control Device as a Covered Benefit of the HUSKY Health Program

This policy transmittal is being issued in order to clarify the statement made by the Food & Drug Administration (FDA) and The Bayer Group in relation to the sale of a non-surgical, non-hormonal implanted birth control device and to provide additional information regarding the sale of the device announced this month.

In April 2018, the Federal Food & Drug Administration (FDA) issued a restriction to limit the sale of a non-surgical, non-hormonal implanted birth control device to medical providers who counsel patients according to the Additionally, as recently approved label. announced in July 2018, by the manufacturer, this device will no longer be sold or distributed after December 31, 2018. As a result, as previously communicated in PB 2018-26, effective July 1, 2018, the Department of Social Services (DSS) no longer covers non-surgical, non-hormonal implanted birth control devices or any similar devices under the HUSKY Health program.

Effective for dates of service July 1, 2018 and forward, the permanent implantable contraceptive intratubal occlusion device and delivery system that is used as part of bilateral fallopian tube cannulation to induce occlusion by placement of permanent implants procedure is no longer covered under the Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) code A4264-Intratubal occlusion device. Other birth control devices such as the Falope ring and filshie clips remain covered and should continue to be billed under HCPCS code A4264. Additionally, Current Procedure Terminology (CPT) code 58565 - Hysteroscopy sterilization was end-dated for dates of service, July 1, 2018 and forward on the following fee schedules: physician-surgical, ambulatory surgical centers, and family planning clinics. The CPT code will be changed to a "No" under the payment type column on the Connecticut Medical Assistance Program Addendum B for outpatient hospitals.
