**TO: Freestanding Dialysis Clinics**

**RE: Updates to the Reimbursement for Physician-Administered Drugs, Immune Globulins, Vaccines and Toxoids**

The Department of Social Services (DSS) is updating the rates for physician administered drugs, immune globulins, vaccines, and toxoids effective for dates of service January 1, 2022 and forward.

The rates for physician-administered drugs, immune globulins, vaccines, and toxoids will be revised to equal 100% of the January 2022 Medicare Average Sales Price (ASP) Drug Pricing file. Providers must continue to include the standard 11-digit National Drug Code (NDC) on all claims for physician-administered drugs, immune globulins, vaccines, and toxoids to avoid it being denied or the incorrect reimbursement.
